

As you are aware, IMA is constantly working in safeguarding the interests of the medical fraternity, be it medical students, junior doctors or regular members. We have multiple issues affecting our profession and we are taking necessary measures on all fronts. We are also concerned about the problems faced by the patients and are committed for their welfare.

Our HPV vaccination training program needs to gather steam and I urge all the Presidents and Secretaries of the States and Local branches to ensure a sizeable portion of their members complete this training at the earliest. I also request that all conferences by the local and State branches of IMA and the different Wings of IMA include 1 session on HPV Vaccination training.

My visits to different State and Local branch events have been very gratifying and I really commend the excellent work being done, the passion for IMA and the dedication to your branch. It is heartening to see even the small and remote branches do regular programs with great innovation and keep the flag of IMA flying high. We have written to the GST Council regarding exempting essential drugs, life-saving medical equipment and health insurance from GST and hope for a positive outcome.

As per reports, there are plans afoot to start integrated courses of BAMS and MBBS and we have very strongly objected to this mixopathy and are pursuing the matter through multiple ways. If implemented it will sound a death knell for modern medicine. I urge you to activate your State and Local branches on this issue, have meetings with public representatives, apprise the public about its dangers and be ready for an agitation if things don't work out. We need to be united, active, and alert.

From the Desk of Honorary Secretary General



Dear Friends,

Greetings from IMA HQs.

I am pleased to share with you the latest updates and activities from the Indian Medical Association (IMA) over the past month. These include important meetings, policy discussions, committee work, and key issues raised with government authorities. As always, IMA continues to work actively for the betterment of the medical profession and to address the concerns of our members across the country. I am pleased to share recent updates and key developments from across the Indian Medical Association

We are organizing separate meetings of various Standing Committees and with select State Branches to provide a focused platform where each State can openly and thoroughly present its specific challenges, issues, and suggestions. This approach allows for more meaningful discussions and better understanding of their local concerns

A Zoom meeting was held on 3rd June 2025 with the Presidents and Secretaries of Chhattisgarh, Chandigarh, Delhi, Goa, and Gujarat to discuss the problems in the respective States alongwith their State reports. Another Zoom meeting took place on 12th June 2025 with the Presidents and Secretaries of Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, and Karnataka for similar discussions.

IMA Standing Committee for Social Media was held on 4th June 2025 and on the same day another combined meeting was held for the IMA Standing Committees on Disaster Management, Blood Donation & Blood Bank, and Organ Donation to discuss their work.

On 12th June, a joint meeting of the IMA Standing Committees on Social Media, Socio-Cultural Affairs, and Food & Nutrition was also held to review their activities

A virtual meeting of the Junior Doctors' Network (JDN) was held on 25th June 2025. The agenda included forming a national JDN council and discussing key issues. Another Disaster Management Committee meeting was held on 2nd July 2025. The meeting discussed assigning states to members, setting responsibilities, reviewing progress, and other related matters.

IMA also met with the GST Council to raise important issues related to healthcare. We requested that GST be reduced or removed on life-saving medicines, commonly used drugs, and essential medical equipment. We also asked for the removal of GST on hospital beds and health insurance to make healthcare more affordable. Many branches are facing problems with GST and TAN registrations due to technical issues, and we have requested the government to fix this. We also spoke about the unfair GST charges on membership fees collected from 2017 to 2021, which the Kerala High Court has ruled as unconstitutional. Additionally, interest on the GST demand related to membership fees, which was due in March 2023, has accumulated to approximately Rs64 lakhs as of today. Considering the legal precedents set by the Kerala High Court ruling and the financial burden imposed on a professional non-profit organization, IMA formally requested the GST Council to waive the interest liability in accordance with principles of fairness and justice

IMA received a letter from Dr. Sanjay Kumar Mattoo, Joint Commissioner of the Central TB Division, about guidelines for certifying TB patients on treatment as non-infectious. This guidance has been shared with all State Branches to pass on to doctors and hospitals treating TB under the National TB Elimination Programme (NTEP).



IMA wrote to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Shri Devendra Fadnavis, to strongly oppose a recent notification by the Maharashtra Medical Council (MMC). The notification allows homeopathic practitioners with a short course in modern pharmacology (CCMP) to register under the MMC. IMA believes this is harmful to public health and the standards of modern medicine, and has requested the decision be cancelled.

IMA has also written to the Hon'ble Health Minister, Shri J. P. Nadda, supporting a request from the Faculty Associations of AIIMS and PGIMER to start a system of Rotatory Headship in their institutes. This system has already been implemented in top institutions like IITs and IIMs. We believe this will bring more fairness, transparency, and align Indian institutions with international best practices.

IMA has also submitted a comprehensive representation to Hon'ble Union Health Minister Dr. J.P. Nadda, highlighting urgent issues affecting the medical community. Key demands include implementation of the Inter-Ministerial Committee's recommendations, adoption of the IMA Health Manifesto 2024, enactment of a Central Law to prevent violence against doctors, exclusion of medical professionals from the Consumer Protection Act, repeal or reform of the PCPNDT Act, abolition of the bond system for medical graduates, exemption of small hospitals from the Clinical Establishment Act, and strict regulation of allied health professionals under AHPA 2021. The IMA also strongly opposes the registration of homeopathy practitioners post-CCMP and the government's push towards "Mixopathy," warning it threatens the integrity of scientific medical practice and public safety.

IMA has submitted its views to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health & Family Welfare on improving healthcare accessibility and affordability. IMA emphasizes that while access and cost are vital, quality and human dignity must not be compromised. It calls for a significant increase in public health investment, recommending that the Centre and States together allocate 5% of GDP, compared to the current 1.1%. IMA advocates for universal healthcare system in which Govt. use this fund covering primary to tertiary care, with strategic use of private providers for the underprivileged. It warns against an insurance-led model that may mirror the high-cost, inequitable U.S. system. The association also highlights the need to protect and promote small and medium doctor-run hospitals, which are accessible and affordable but currently threatened by overregulation and corporate-centric policies. IMA concludes that India has made notable progress in healthcare access, but future reforms must ensure dignity and quality for all.

We've seen that some branches are not following basic IMA rules during meetings. For example, some are skipping the IMA Prayer and Flag Salutation. Also, sometimes the names of National Leaders are used in event invites without asking them first. We kindly remind all branches to follow the proper rules and show respect for these procedures.

Together we can achieve the goals of IMA

Greetings from Indian Medical Association!

We write to you with deep concern and disappointment over the recent incidents in Goa and Jharkhand, where medical professionals were subjected to harassment by political leaders at Goa Medical College and Hazaribagh Government Medical College, respectively. These distressing actions demonstrate blatant disrespect towards the medical community and contribute to an atmosphere of fear, mistrust, and demoralization within our already strained healthcare system.

The medical profession has always stood as a pillar of compassion, ethics, and unwavering commitment to public service. While we remain resolute in our duty to prioritize patient care, it is imperative that our dignity, safety, and rights are safeguarded. The events in question are not isolated; they highlight a growing pattern of disregard for the sanctity of the medical profession.

It is particularly troubling when elected representatives—entrusted with upholding justice and maintaining public order—engage in behaviour that erodes these very principles. Such conduct not only jeopardizes the morale of the medical fraternity but also risks weakening public trust in both our governance and healthcare systems.

We therefore respectfully urge the Government of India to consider the following demands of IMA:

1. **Strengthen Legal Protections:** Amend the Medicare Service Personnel and Medicare Service Institutions Acts across all states to make any form of violence or harassment against healthcare professionals a non-bailable offense, with a minimum punishment of seven years' imprisonment.
2. **Enforce Supreme Court Guidelines:** Ensure rigorous implementation of the recommendations issued by the National Task Force appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court regarding the protection and welfare of resident doctors and healthcare workers.
3. **Issue Public Reassurance:** Send a clear message that acts of intimidation or violence against doctors will not be tolerated, irrespective of the status or position of the culprits.

As doctors, we have always upheld the Hippocratic Oath and stood on the frontlines—be it during pandemics, disasters, or routine care. We do not ask for privilege; we ask for dignity, respect, and the assurance that we can perform our duties without fear.

We trust that your esteemed office will take immediate and firm action to address these concerns and restore the confidence of the medical fraternity and the public at large.

As doctors, we do not compromise on our dignity. We remain steadfast in upholding the Hippocratic Oath and serving humanity, especially in times of crisis. However, we also expect that our service be met with respect, security, and justice.

CONCERN REGARDING AUTHORIZATION OF DENTAL SURGEONS TO PERFORM GENERAL SURGERY/GENERAL PRACTICE

Please find attached the following letters for your reference:

1. Letter received from the Rajasthan State Dental Council, Jaipur
2. Communication from Government Dental College & Hospitals

Both documents indicate that dental surgeons have been authorized to perform general surgery and/or general medical practice. We wish to express our deep concern regarding this development.

General surgery and general practice require extensive training and qualifications, specifically an M.S. in General Surgery or equivalent recognized medical qualifications. Authorizing individuals without this training poses a serious risk to patient safety and compromises the standards of medical care.

It is deeply troubling that the National Medical Commission would permit dental professionals—who are not trained or qualified in general medicine or surgery—to undertake such responsibilities. We respectfully urge you to review this matter urgently and take corrective action to uphold the integrity of medical practice in India.

Thank you for your attention to this important issue.



IMA JOINS FOGSI TO ELIMINATE CERVICAL CANCER- STRENGTHENING GOVERNMENT'S PROGRAMME ON HPV VACCINATION

Greetings from IMA Hqs!

India is gearing up to eliminate cervical cancer through HPV vaccination, "Do Teeke Zindagi Ke" As you know, our country bears nearly 25% of the world's cervical cancer deaths. And yet, most of these are preventable through timely HPV vaccination and routine screening. While the national screening programme is going on, the real shift must now happen on the ground by transforming how communities view HPV vaccination. That shift begins with us.

This is where IMA steps in with all its members with a collective purpose and leadership. As physicians, we are the most trusted voices in our communities. That trust must be channelled to dispel myths and build confidence in HPV vaccination. Our patients believe in our guidance that is accurate and evidence-based. It is essential they hear the right message from us, shared in their setting, in their language, and with sensitivity.

IMA has launched a nationwide academic initiative to build public confidence in HPV vaccination and support India's goal to eliminate cervical cancer. For the first time, expert faculty from the Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI) will train 50,000 IMA members across the country. Members are not expected to vaccinate, but rather to prepare for the community-level conversations that will follow when the Government of India rolls out free HPV vaccination for adolescent girls under the Universal Immunisation Programme (UIP).

This initiative, developed with the Cancer Foundation of India, and the American Cancer Society, is purely academic in nature that strengthens how we as physicians talk about the HPV vaccine with parents, with adolescents, and with our communities.

Under this programme, trained National HPV Faculty (NHF) from FOGSI will train IMA physicians, with a special focus on general physicians, gynaecologists, paediatricians, and other frontline practitioners in Tier 2, 3, and 4 cities. This is a one-hour Zoom training customised for our members carefully designed to provide you with the tools to address vaccine hesitancy and promote acceptance. Upon completion, each participating member will receive a certificate.

I write to you today to ensure that every member of your branch participates in this one-hour virtual training. Your active involvement is vital to leave no IMA member behind. Let's show the power of IMA's collective voice—strong, united, and informed—to strengthen this national effort.

1. Be the best performing branch in IMA. Ensure all your members attend the ZOOM training
2. Receive the HPV award for your branch by mobilising members (for 5 best branches)
3. Receive HPV award for your State by being the best State (for top 5 states)

Greetings from Indian Medical Association!

IMA is a largest Association of medical practitioners practising modern system of medicine throughout the country remains committed to upholding the standards of ethical, evidence-based healthcare and ensuring the well-being of the nation. As a vital stakeholder in the healthcare delivery system, IMA has consistently contributed to shaping public health policy and strengthening the doctor-patient relationship. In view of recent developments and ongoing challenges faced by the medical fraternity, we seek your kind attention and urgent intervention on the following issues of concern. While this list does not encompass all our concerns, it highlights the most pressing issues that we believe merit immediate attention from the Government of India:

Inter-Ministerial Committee: (Annexure 1)

This is to draw your kind attention towards the Inter-Ministerial Committee constituted under the Chairmanship of Additional Secretary (Health), Ministry of health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India to examine the issues raised by Indian Medical Association. After having multiple meetings, the above Committee issued its Report. Although this Committee had given its positive report, but it has not been seen the light of the day.

We are once again, submitting our following demands which are most pressing issues that we believe immediate attention from the Government of India:

IMA Health Manifesto 2024: (Annexure 2)

IMA had prepared a Health Manifesto -2024 which includes IMA's concerns related to health and policy positions. Through this manifesto, IMA reaffirms its commitment to promoting the highest standards of physical, mental, and social well-being across all sections of society. IMA urged the Government to recognize health as a fundamental human right and to develop a comprehensive public health strategy.

We submit this manifesto for your kind consideration, once again, and support in taking forward its key recommendations.

Violence against Doctors: (Annexure 3)

23 State Hospital protection laws have not brought solace to doctors against violence. IMA urgently appeals for a comprehensive Central Law to address the escalating violence against doctors and healthcare establishments. Despite repeated engagements with the Government—including draft legislations and the temporary measures under the Epidemic Diseases (Amendment) Act, 2020—incidents of violence continue, with inadequate FIRs and few convictions under existing state laws.

Given the national scope and the vulnerability of healthcare professionals in their workplaces, we believe a strong deterrent in the form of a Central Act is imperative. We respectfully request your kind



consideration and support in enacting such legislation, and in urging State Governments to strengthen their own laws by:

Incorporating the 2020 amendments of the Epidemic Diseases Act, and
Adopting proven protocols like Kerala's "Code Grey" for prevention and response.

This step is essential to ensure the safety and dignity of the medical community and uphold the fundamental right to life.

IMA demands enactment of a strong Central Act against violence on doctors and hospitals. Declare Hospitals and Health Care institutions as safe zones.

Consumer Protection Act: (Annexure 4)

We wish to draw your attention to a significant matter concerning the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 (CPA 2019) and its implications for the healthcare sector. As outlined in the Consumer Protection Act Bill, 2018, there is a clear legislative intent to exclude healthcare services from the purview of CPA 2019. In light of this, we kindly request that you notify an executive order detailing this legislative intent, ensuring clarity and legal certainty for both healthcare providers and consumers.

There is no criminal intent in any treatment procedure. Criminal prosecution of doctors is self-defeating. Defensive medicine affects patient care and the cost.

Furthermore, we humbly suggest that a dedicated Medical Malpractice Act be enacted, incorporating a provision for capping of compensation. This measure would not only protect healthcare professionals from disproportionate litigation but would also ensure that consumers receive fair and timely redress in cases of genuine malpractice. Exempt the medical profession from criminal prosecution.

PCPNDT: (Annexure 5)

Your further attention is drawn regarding the repeal of PCPNDT Act. IMA puts up to the Government for a change in the policy of Save the Girl Child Initiative. The current PCPNDT Act after 3 decades of implementation has failed to reverse the sex ratio. It has inflicted harassment on the doctor-community in legitimate practice of the profession. It is in fitness of things to detect the sex of the child and provide protection and oversight until the girl child is delivered. There cannot be a medical solution to a social evil. The culprits who commit female foeticide or infanticide should be punished.

Bond Policy (Annexure 6)

The bond system for medical graduates in India is a contract between the student and the state government or college authority to fulfill certain conditions, such as serving in rural areas or providing medical expertise in the state of their education. If the conditions are not met, the student must pay a hefty penalty to the state or institute.

IMA demands abolition of the Bond system for medical students and graduates.

Clinical Establishment Act: (Annexure 7)

Exempt small and medium hospitals up to 50 beds and clinics from The Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Act 2010

We remain hopeful and confident that, under your esteemed leadership, the concerns of the medical fraternity will continue to be addressed with the same commitment and responsiveness as in the past.

**Regarding recent developments under AHPA – 2024 (Annexure 8)**

We wish to draw your kind attention to serious concerns arising from recent developments under the Allied and Healthcare Professionals Act, 2021, particularly in light of the curriculum published by the National Commission for Allied and Healthcare Professions (NCAHP). While we support the intent to regulate and standardize the training and registration of allied and healthcare professionals, we are deeply concerned about certain provisions and curriculum descriptions that could inadvertently lead to independent and unsupervised clinical practice by these professionals—posing significant risks to public health and undermining the established team-based model of modern medicine.

Background: Allied and Healthcare Professionals Act 2021, which aims to regulate and maintain standards of education and services by allied and healthcare professionals. NCAHP has recently published curriculum of some of the courses. We highlight concerns about provisions implying independent practice by some allied health professionals, which could undermine public health and the team-based approach in modern medicine. It is emphasized that allied health professionals should work under the supervision of medical practitioners and not use the prefix "Dr." before their names.

IMA had submitted the implications of the ALLIED AND HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS ACT 2021 to Hon'ble Union Health Minister alongwith its curriculum of some of the courses published by NCAHP emphasizing the need for regulation of allied health professionals while expressing concerns about certain provisions that may undermine public health. The copy of the same is also being sent to you for your information and necessary action.

Urgent Representation Against the MMC Registration of Homeopathic Practitioners Post-CCMP Course (Annexure 9)

We refer to the notification issued by the Maharashtra Medical Council (MMC) dated 30/06/2025 (Ref: MMC/CCMP Registration/2025/03866), which permits registration under the MMC for homeopathic practitioners who have completed the "Certificate Course in Modern Pharmacology (CCMP)."

Sir, this decision is deeply concerning and fundamentally flawed for several reasons. The IMA strongly opposes this move, as it undermines the integrity of the modern medical system and poses serious risks to public health. IMA had submitted its representation to the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Government of Maharashtra and requested him to reconsider and revoke this decision in the larger interest of both medical professionals and the general public. The copy of the same is also being sent to you for your information and necessary action.

Mixopathy – a great concern for medical fraternity and public at large (Annexure 10)

It is unfortunate that the Union Government seems to go ahead with its plans to unscientific mixing of systems of medicine. Reports indicate that the first integrative course mixing MBBS and BAMS would be started in the premier institution of JIPMER, Pondicherry.

In this regard, IMA had written a letter to Hon'ble Union Health Minister and demands the Government to withdraw this regressive proposal in the interest of the health of the Indian citizens.

**IMA'S PERSPECTIVES ON THE ACCESSIBILITY AND AFFORDABILITY OF HEALTH CARE IN BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS**

Greetings from Indian Medical Association, the century old institution of modern medicine doctors borne out of the Freedom Struggle of India. IMA has its Headquarters in Delhi with state branches in all states. The Four lakh members of IMA are spread over 1800 local branches in all the districts of India.

We congratulate the Committee on inviting perspectives on the accessibility and affordability of Health Care in both Public and Private institutions. We legitimately expect seminal policy changes from the lawmakers. We would like to add that accessibility and affordability have to be tempered with quality and dignity as well.

The following are the core principles of IMA point of view in this regard :

1. State Leadership in Health. Both the Centre and the States together should allocate 5% of GDP to Health. That amounts to 18 Lakh crores of rupees. The current allocated amount of all the Governments put together is 3.6 Lakh crores of which the Central Government share is 88000 crores (one fourth). The Leadership in Health today remains with the private sector which chips in 2.8 % of GDP ie around 9 Lakh crores of rupees.
2. Tax funded Universal Healthcare with basic package in primary, secondary and tertiary care for all citizens without intermediaries. Strategic purchase of care from private sector for BPL families.
3. The current missing middle concept of NITI Aayog favouring the insurance industry will lead the country to the US model where 15% Healthcare expenditure of a GDP of 30 trillion dollars has left 20% of Americans with no Healthcare.
4. India has a strong network of small and medium hospitals run by doctors. These institutions are eminently accessible and affordable and are run by the profession (doctor entrepreneurs) These institutions are disappearing due to over regulation and policies as well as schemes favouring the For Profit Corporate sector. These professional institutions run by doctors deserve regulations and incentives different from the For Profit sector.
5. India has done well in accessibility and affordability of Healthcare. One needs to only look at what is in store in other countries.
6. Accessibility and affordability achieved without quality and human dignity is unacceptable.

Our perspective on these lines has been outlined in the appended document. We thank the Honourable Committee for giving us an opportunity.




